

2019 Rebates Coming to a Close

Rebates may change in 2020

The new year brings the end of 2019 Power Moves rebates. While we are confident rebates will continue in 2020, we do not have all the details on upcoming changes. If you are planning - or have purchased an eligible heat pump HVAC, heat pump water heater or pool pump, please send in your rebate as soon as possible. All installation must be completed by December 31, 2019, to be eligible.

We currently do not anticipate an increase in minimum efficiency standards or a reduction in rebate. It is also unlikely that Power Moves will make substantial changes to any HVAC systems that are currently eligible for a rebate. Power Moves Rebates for 2020 have not been finalized and could change before January 1, 2020.

All 2019 Power Moves rebates must be turned in by March 1, 2020. However, CEC strongly suggests turning in your completed rebate application as soon as possible. Power Moves often sees an influx of applications at the end of the year. This can delay rebate checks and members run the risk of exhausting Power Moves funding.

Are You Winter Storm Ready?

Our area can experience rain, snow, ice or all of the above when winter weather rolls through. While rain and snow are rarely a major threat, ice can down trees and power lines. Such an outage during very cold weather creates an additional set of challenges and safety requirements. Prepare now to ensure you're not left in the cold when the next one happens.

CEC recommends assembling an emergency kit with essential items and more, such as:

- Flashlight, portable radio and extra batteries
- First aid kit and essential medicines
- Non-perishable food
- Bottled water
- Basic tools and related materials
- Extra blankets and clothing to dress in layers
- Outerwear at the ready, including hats, gloves and scarves
- Rags or duct tape to seal air leaks


If you have a wood stove or fireplace, have plenty of extra wood on hand; and if you have a fuel-based heater, have extra fuel and the means to vent the fumes.

Know how you can get area weather updates, such as a weather radio, mobile notification system you can enroll in, mobile app, etc. Download CEC Mobile to report outages or view our outage map. You can also follow CEC on Facebook for updates. Keep your mobile devices fully charged and ready to use when a storm is headed your way.
